College Profile

Geelong Lutheran College Armstrong Creek is dedicated to improving the quality of education for all students under its care now and into the future. It is a Child Safe organisation with a zero tolerance for child abuse and is committed to acting in the best interests of children.

As a school of the Lutheran Church of Australia, we are dedicated to providing an education for our students that is informed by strong Christian principles and underpinned by the values that make our Lutheran schools across Australia unique. The College endeavours to maintain an established framework of Christian attitudes and relationships which permeate and integrate its entire life and work. This provides a strong basis for the initiative of Lifelong Learning. This encourages living in community and reflecting characteristics of God through our core values of wisdom, honour and purpose.

Established in 2009, Geelong Lutheran College Armstrong Creek is situated in the urban growth area of the City of Greater Geelong, close to the Surf Coast area. The College celebrated its 10th anniversary at the start of the year. It is a Prep to Year 12 school offering a welcoming, lively and nurturing environment with a focus on providing a quality, Christian education.

At Geelong Lutheran College Armstrong Creek we celebrate the diversity and giftedness of all within our community. Education is a learning journey in which we acknowledge parents as primary educators and feel privileged to join in partnership with them through their child's education.

The ministry and mission of the College provides the framework for our student wellbeing, teaching and learning programs. These programs enable us to foster a passion for learning and the holistic development of each child. Pastoral care is one of the main focuses, integrating personal and social wellbeing and resilience. The students of our College are challenged to think as global citizens, consider the needs of those beyond their local community and to recognise the responsibilities their education provides as they take their places in work, social and family networks of the 21st century.

Mission and Ministry

Christian education is woven into every aspect of life at the College and we are proud of our distinctly Lutheran identity. Central to the mission and ministry of the College is the teaching and learning of Christian Studies. In 2019, students from Prep through to Year 12 continued to develop their understandings of faith and religion through the weekly teaching of Christian Studies. This has been supported by the Lutheran Education Australia Christian Studies Curriculum Framework.

Weekly worship continues to be a focal point for our students, staff, parents and wider community. Led by various members of our leadership, the College Pastor, students and staff, our worship services are a highlight which continue to allow each student to develop their faith journey. This is supported by staff devotion, morning devotions in classes, student homegroups and opening and closing services during the year.

Staff continued to be enriched in their faith journey through the Equip program for Christian Studies teachers. Teachers of Christian Studies are required to complete this important program which has been developed by Lutheran Education Australia in conjunction with the Church and schools.

Serving our community continues to be a focal point throughout the College with activities spread across the year levels. A highlight for us in 2019 was the annual cultural experience tour to Vanuatu in July. Attended by 11 students, the outcomes and experience of this trip was transformational for those who participated.

Teacher Standards & Qualifications

Geelong Lutheran College Armstrong Creek values the dedication and experience of its staff. In 2019, GLC AC had a total of 81 staff with 52 of these actively involved in the work of teaching. Staff are trained to support student learning.

The school is committed to ensuring that staff are employed with appropriate qualifications and who will actively support the Christian ethos of the school. The school will continually develop the staff both professionally and personally through relevant professional growth opportunities.

All teachers at Geelong Lutheran College Armstrong Creek are appropriately qualified and hold registration with the Victorian Institute of Teaching.

All staff members are trained in LEA's Valuing Safe Communities to ensure compliance with the Lutheran Church of Australia requirements. An approved Child Protection training program has been implemented for all staff and volunteers in the school which is undertaken at the beginning of each year. New employees to the school are trained as part of staff Induction. Relevant staff members are also trained or updated in First Aid, Anaphylaxis Management and Asthma Management.

During the initial staff meeting at the beginning of the year, staff members were briefed on OH&S requirements. This is revisited regularly throughout the year during staff meetings as a standing item on each staff meeting agenda.

Two of our staff accepted positions as VCAA assessors for the 2019 Unit 3 & 4 examinations.

To support student attendance, the College has an Attendance Policy that outlines the roles and responsibilities of the school staff, parents and students.

- Absences are shown 'live' each day via roll marking in SIMON
- Parents of absent students are notified if communication has not been forthcoming
- Unexplained or inadequately explained absences will result in communication with parents and student

- A formal attendance meeting may be organized to resolve ongoing attendance trends and discuss how best to support future attendance and engagement
- Student attendance and absence figures may appear on student academic reports
- Aggregated student attendance data is reported to the Department of Education & Training

Senior Secondary Outcomes

Of the cohort of 36 Year 12 students, 33 attempted VCE and all gained their VCE certificate, securing a 100% VCE pass rate. The remaining three students earned their Senior VCAL certificate. Of the 32 students who applied for University places, 30 were awarded a university placement, with 63% receiving their first preference of university.

All Year 12 students completed their VCE.

- 12.9% of students achieved an ATAR score over 80
- 29% of students achieved an ATAR score over 70
- 77% of students achieved an ATAR score over 50

Finance, Facilities and Resources


